## **Civil War Commemoration Commentary**

Many of you may have noticed that as we embark as a nation to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the Civil War, there has not been a federally-driven, top-down approach such as with the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial. This has really become a state-centered commemoration. While one can argue the merits of this approach, the bottom line is there still is a lot going on regarding the Commemoration. It takes a little more initiative to ferret out the events and related programs, but it is well worth our effort to do so.
